## **Management of Canine Osteoarthritis**

#### 8. Surgical Salvage Options:

- Arthrodesis (joint fusion)
- Total joint replacement (TER, THR, TKR)
- Partial resurfacing (CUE)

If medication treatments are exhausted and there is minimal response, surgical intervention may be recommended based on patient's age, degree of osteoarthritis, and current quality of life.

#### 1. Weight Loss: Ideal BCS should be a 4.5/9

• Maintenance of a light, lean body condition.

- If your pet needs to lose weight, please reduce food intake by 25%. Vegetables can be given as treats or to bulk up meals (broccoli, green beans, and zucchini)
- No other treats should be given until goal weight is reached.

#### 2. Moderate Exercise:

Regular low-to-medium grade exercise (leash walks, gentle free-run) will maintain muscle mass and minimize joint stiffening.

-Physical Therapy (water treadmill sessions, ROM, laser, and acupuncture) can be beneficial in maintaining appropriate function.

## 7. Osteoarthritis Drugs:

- 1. **Synovetin** Radionucleotide injected intra-articular (IA) every 9-12 months
- 2. **Librela** monthly injectable anti-nerve growth factor (NGF) monoclonal antibody (mAb) therapy for dogs with osteoarthritis (OA) pain
- 3. **Spryng** OsteoCushion injected intra-articular (IA)

# 3. Joint Support Supplements: Glucosamine/Chondroitin-

 Preferred brands: Dasuquin & Cosequin/Cosamin by Nutramax; Puritan's Pride (online)

#### Omega-3 Fatty Acids (Fish oil)-

Welactin by Nutramax;
Puritan's Pride (online)

Give daily on a long-term basis for joint health.

## 6. Biologics Treatments:

Platelet-Rich Plasma (PRP) injections – Performed under heavy sedation every three weeks for 2-3 total treatments.

#### Stem cell therapy -

Fat & bone marrow derived; samples banked at outside facility. Requires surgical collection.

## 5. Adequan Injections:

Adequan is an FDA-approved disease-modifying osteoarthritis drug for dogs.

**VetSurg** 

- Injections are administered SC (under the skin) ONCE weekly for 6–8-week trial. If effective, then use every 1-2 weeks long term.
  - \*Injections can be given at home or by your vet's office if you do not feel comfortable giving injections.

## 4. Anti-inflammatory medications (NSAID):

Rimadyl or generic equivalent, Metacam, Deramaxx, Previcox and Galliprant. These medications can be used as needed (PRN) to relieve pain; give prior and/or after exercise.

 Routine lab work recommended to monitor kidney, liver, and GI side effects.
